

Help Welcome Christmas

Looking ahead to Christmas, the Missions Team is asking for your help with three programs – Sidewalk Sunday School, Save the Family and I-HELP.



A couple of years ago, Chandler UMC was paired with Gold Canyon UMC's Sidewalk Sunday School Program for the annual Red Bag event. As a result, we had significantly fewer red bags to fill for the children in Sidewalk Sunday School. This year, we continue our partnership with Gold Canyon, and since we have fewer bags to fill and many people who want to give, we are filling stockings for the single men and women at Save the Family.

Not many single men and women are enrolled in Save the Family's program... this year, just eight men and 23 women. They are men and women whose children have "aged" out of the program, and as such are often a forgotten or overlooked community. They have disabilities that prevent them from working full-time. Some live in Save the Family's affordable housing apartments near their main office or, those who are veterans, live in Save the Family's Valor on Eighth apartments, affordable housing for veterans.

As single men and women, they not "adopted" at Christmas as families are, and the only gift most of these men and women receive is a Christmas stocking filled with small goodies and a \$15 gift card. These stockings are often the highlight of their Christmas.

So, this year, you will see us handing out red bags that need to be filled with small items for the children in Gold Canyon's Sidewalk Sunday School program, and Christmas stockings for the men and women of Save the Family. Please refer to the information included with the bags and stockings for filler ideas. If you prefer, you can take a red envelope to fill with a gift card that can be returned and put in the offering plate on Sundays throughout November. Twenty dollar gift cards will be given to teen-agers at Sidewalk Sunday School, and \$15 gift cards will be added to the stockings for men and women.

We also are supporting the men and women of I-HELP who spend the second Saturday, second Monday and fifth Saturdays at our church. We provide dinner, a sack lunch and shelter for the night. The \$15 Walmart gift cards are our small way to say we love and support you.

2019. He recalled how his mother would

bring home books on the UMW Reading Program which he would read and they would discuss.

Speakers on maternal and child health were Laura Maurer from Wesley Health Centers and Jane Pearson who retired in 2012 after a long career in the public health and non-profit sector. Three focus groups were attended by all.

Billie Fidlin, Conference Director of Outreach and Justice, was the presenter for At The Cost of One's Soul: Race, Reason & Prison which addressed the school to confinement pipeline based on her experiences at Perryville Prison.

United Methodist Women Way Forward was led by Estella Wallace, Western Jurisdiction National UMW Director. She shared that assurances have been given to our UMW sisters in Africa that they will continue to be included in our organization that has lasted 150 years, regardless of the direction the overall Church takes.

Zero Weeks documentary was shown that explored our nation's paid family leave crisis and the cost of doing nothing.


