

Please be aware any email or text coming from Rev. Candace or any staff member at CUMC will **NEVER** ask for gift cards or money. Some general reminders about how you can spot these scams over email or text message:




- Before you open, look at the sender's address or phone number. If the sender's address seems suspicious or is different than the email address or phone number the person typically uses, then it probably is a scam.
- If the subject line seems strange or irregular; it probably is a scam.
- If the message asks you to purchase gift cards or give money, it is probably a scam. If you open the questionable email or reply to the strange text, which we advise against, and you are asked to reply by email or by phone because your assistance is needed with an unnamed situation, it is probably a scam.

#### Take Action

If you received a questionable email or text from someone posing as someone you know, alert the individual about it using the legitimate contact information you have for them and report the scam at <a href="https://reportfraud.ftc.gov">https://reportfraud.ftc.gov</a>

Then, if the fake message was from clergy or looks like it was from Conference staff, let us know so we can amplify the warning to others. Email <a href="mailto:communications@dscumc.org">communications@dscumc.org</a> with details about the scam.


